Buena Park Police Department Holding DUI Checkpoint March 15th

Buena Park, Calif. – On March 15th, the Buena Park Police Department will conduct a driving under the influence (DUI) Checkpoint on March 15th from 8 p.m. to 3 a.m. at an undisclosed location.

DUI checkpoint locations are determined based on data showing incidents of impaired driving-related crashes. The primary purpose of DUI checkpoints is to promote public safety by taking suspected impaired drivers off the road.

"Impaired drivers put others on the road at significant risk," Sergeant Connor Lee said. "Any prevention measures that reduce the number of impaired drivers on our roads significantly improve traffic safety."

Buena Park Police Department reminds the public that impaired driving is not just from alcohol. Some prescription medications and over-the-counter drugs may interfere with driving. While medicinal and recreational marijuana are legal, driving under the influence of marijuana is illegal.

Drivers charged with a first-time DUI face an average of \$13,500 in fines and penalties, as well as a suspended license.
